Extra3 of a Letter from Petersburg, April 13, N. S.

The Arrival of three young Ladies, brought up to Town under an Escorte, makes a great Noise here, on account of the Singularity of the Cafe, which is not only extraordinary, but

us precedented.

Thole Ladies, who are the Daughters of Count Douglass, Lieutenant General, to whom the Empress had just granted a Difmilion from her Service, applied to the Governor of Revel, where they refided, praying him to put them under Arrest; alleging that they had some important Things to communicate to her Imperial Majetty against their Father, which were of a treasonable Nature. The Governor did all he could to divert them from so unnatural a Design: He shewed them the Danger to which they exposed themselves and all their Family. Among other Thirgs be represented to them, that according to the Laws of the Empire, the Party that impeaches any one of a capital Crime, mult undergo the Rack three Times before the Perion accused can be put to the Torture. Lat his Exhortations were fruitless; the three Ladies persisted in their Refolution, and even threatened the Governor with an Information against himself, if he any longer delayed to great their Request; to that he was forced to comply and fend them

As from as Count Douglass heard of the shocking Proceeding of his Daughters, he immediately potted up to Town, in order to prevent, it possible, the terrible Consequences of it. Several Persons, who interest themselves in this Affair, have made Reprelentations to the Empress about it, urging in particular a Law of the Emperor Peter the Great, which enachs. That if any Children be found to void of Duty and natural Affection, as to impeach their Parents, their Accusation shall not only be rejected, but they thall be moreover severely punished, and

then lent back to their Parents. Se.

We con't yet know what Effect these Representations have had, but we are affared that the Emprels has refolved to have thote Ladies examined in her Presence: In the mean while Count Douglais is put under Arreit. It is faid his three Daughters have defired to be admitted to embrace the Greek Religion. Our Sea and Land Officers are fetting out successively for their respective Posts. The Fleet at Cronsladt confils of 35 Ships of the Line, and Frigates; and part of the Gallics are ordered to be equipped and victualled for three Months. Divers Orders of a private Nature have been fent to Revel, and other Cities, in Consequence of the Discoveries made by

Count Douglass's Daughters.'

Afril 25. Last Monday the following most extraordinary Afrair happened at Tring in Hersfordshire; some of the Country People having entertained an Opinion that an old Man and Woman in that Town were Witches, on Account of feveral Cattle dving of the present Contagion, great Numbers allembled, some on Horseback and others on Foot, and went in a Body and proclaimed them as such, in three different Market Towns; and about four in the Afternoon returned to 'iring, and demanded the supposed Witches, whom the Inhabitants had tent to the Workhouse for Security, which the enranged Populace being informed of, went thither, and being restated Admittance, they pulled down the greatest Part of the Workhouse, and a House adjacent; but the Master, in the mean while, having conveyed them to the Vestry of the Church, they afterwards affembled there, obliging the Mafter of the Workhaufe to go with them; they took them out by Violence, and carried them two Miles from the Town, where they bound the poor iold Woman, Hands and Feet, and after beating her in a cruel and barbarque Manner, threw her into a Pond of Water, where the perished; the old Man was likewife treated in the tame Manner, but fortunately happened to turvive their Croelty. Several Perfors are fince taken and committed to Cultody, for so inhuman a Proceeding; and an Enquiry is ordered to be made, by Mr. Atkinson, Coroner of the County, into the Affair, and a Jury of Gentlemen fummoned to attend at Tring on the Occasion.

May 8.
