

Mr. Blackstone from the committee delivers the following report :

The committee to whom was referred the memorial of the president and trustees of Charlotte Hall School, beg leave to report, That they have had the same under consideration, and find that the prayer of the memorialists is reasonable, and if granted would in a great degree relieve the institution from her present embarrassment, which it appears was in a great measure owing to the incursions of the enemy in that neighbourhood in the memorable year of 1814. Your committee are further of opinion, that the donation to that institution is not equal to many other donations which are given to other institutions similarly situated. Your committee therefore recommend the following resolution.

Resolved, That the state of Maryland release to the trustees of Charlotte Hall School the interest which is now due, or may hereafter become due, on the sum of one thousand pounds loaned by the state to the trustees of said school.

On motion by Mr. Blackstone, the following resolution was read :

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore shall be and he is hereby authorised and empowered, to subscribe on the part of the state on account of the stock reserved in the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Baltimore, ten thousand dollars, and that the amount thereof be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

On motion by Mr. Hands, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act therein mentioned, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Hands, Hambleton and Driver, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill for the relief of John Reasoner, of Allegany county ; the bill for the benefit of the heirs of John Jonas, deceased, of Allegany county, and the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to prevent trespasses in Allegany county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to the second reading of so much of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice as relates to Judge Bland. On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the question was put, That the further consideration thereof be referred to the next general assembly? Determined in the negative.

The house then proceeded to the examination of the witnesses on the part of the house, and on the part of Judge Bland, and after hearing their testimony, on motion by Mr. Potts, the question was put, That the house adopt the following order? Ordered, That no solemn adjudication having taken place in the sixth judicial district of this state, upon the constitutionality of the law vesting equity jurisdiction in the county courts, which was the foundation of the present enquiry, that the same be dismissed, and the honourable judge Bland be deemed acquitted of the charge contained in the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice. Resolved unanimously in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the question was put, That so much of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice as relates to Judge Hollingsworth now have a second reading? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the more easy administration of justice in this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Stodder, Causin, Lecompte, Hambleton, Williams, Potts and Roberts, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The report on the petition of Elisha Browne, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The report in favour of John Norris of Harford county, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Kell delivers a memorial from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore, praying the increase of compensation to the justices of the orphans court of Baltimore county ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Warner and Harryman.

Mr. Beard delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the purposes therein mentioned ; which was read.

Mr. Bradford delivers a bill, entitled, An act for laying out and opening a road in Harford county ; which was read.

Mr. Thomas delivers a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge ; which was read.

Mr. Hambleton delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising Joseph Darden, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collections ; which was read.

Mr. Tomlinson delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Allegany county ; which was read.

Mr. Hands delivers a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act therein mentioned, and for other purposes ; which was read.

Mr. Kell delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Medical Society of Baltimore. Also a bill, entitled, An act relating to inquests held by coroners ; which were severally read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to extend the powers of the levy court of Washington county ; the additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Washington county ; the supplement to the act, entitled, An act for opening and extending Saint Paul's street in the city and precincts of Baltimore ; the bill to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough in Washington county to the Conococheague creek at William's port, and the bill to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county, severally endorsed, " will pass."
