By the Senate, January 19th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate concur in your proposal to go into the election of a senator on Tuesday next at 12 o'clock, to supply the vacancy in the senate of the United States, occasioned by the resignation of the honourable Edward Lloyd.

Also the resolution making an appropriation for the government house, endorsed, "assented to."

And a communication from the executive, with a report from the directors of the penitentiary; referred to the committee on that subject.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Friday, January 20, 1826.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolutions authorising the executive to employ counsel in the case of Charles Browning, was sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill in favour of Elizabeth Winters, and the bill to introduce wholesome water into the city of Frederick, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to make valid the acts and proceedings of justices of the peace in this state, and the bill to extend the time of taking the bond of the sheriff of Saint-Mary's county, severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.

The bill authorising the recording of a deed therein mentioned; endorsed "will not pass."

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of negro Caroline, of Caroline county, and a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Samuel Lee, of Harford county, severally endorsed "will pass;" which were read.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the justices of the orphans court of Cecil county, relative to the school fund.

Mr. Rogerson presents a petition from Wady Posey; and Mr. Gant presents a petition from Mary Russell, for support; referred to the committee on that subject.

Mr. Tyson presents a petition from Daniel Sprinkle, of the city of Baltimore, praying compensation for the loss of certain property; referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.
