

On motion by Mr. Peach, the bill, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Prince George's county, was, by a special order, read the second time and passed.

The house adjourned until Monday morning next 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, January 8, 1827.

The house met. Were present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution respecting an index to the journal of proceedings of each house, received from the senate, with the message relating thereto, adopted by this house on Saturday last, were sent to the senate.

The speaker laid before the house a report of the number of votes taken for and against the act for the establishment of primary schools, passed at the last session, in the second election district of Queen-Anne's county, made in conformity with the directions of the 29th section of said act; which was referred to the standing committee on public instruction.

Mr. Stricker presented a petition from The Vigilant Fire Insurance Company, of the city of Baltimore, praying an act of incorporation; which was read and referred to Messrs. Stricker, Tyson and Peach.

Mr. Tyson presented a petition from Henrietta P. Lowe, of the city of Baltimore, praying a divorce a vinculo matrimonii; referred to the standing committee on that subject.

Mr. Tyson presented further documents and papers in the case of Ann Culverwell, a petitioner for a divorce; which were referred to the standing committee on that subject.

Mr. Hope presented a petition from Elizabeth Shaw, of Harford county, praying a divorce; which was read and referred to the standing committee on that subject.

Mr. Speed presented a petition from Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and others, praying relief for certain minors therein mentioned; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the leave granted to report a bill for the relief of certain minors.

Mr. Compton presented a petition from sundry inhabitants of Anne Arundel and Baltimore counties, praying for a bridge across the Patapsco Falls, at the Thistle Factory; which was read and referred to Messrs. Compton, Stewart, Buchanan, Turner and Peter.

Mr. Bennett obtained leave to report a bill to be entitled, An act to repeal an act relating to the public roads in Talbot county, passed at December session 1825; and Messrs. Bennett, Reyner and Denny, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.

Mr. Bennett also obtained leave to report a bill to be entitled, An act authorising the several orphans courts of this state to order the sale of real estates in certain cases; and Messrs. Bennett, Hope, Barnes, Turner and John W. Thomas, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.
