

Mr. Du Val obtained leave to report a bill to be entitled, An act for the relief of Fielder Cross, of Prince-George's county; and Messrs. Du Val, Peach and Beall, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.

Mr. Crabb obtained leave to report a bill to be entitled, A supplement to an act to alter and amend the charter of the city of Annapolis; and Messrs. Crabb, John W. Thomas and Speed, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.

Mr. Brown moved for leave to report a bill, to be entitled, An act for the benefit of securities on bonds, notes, bills, and other instruments of writing, for the payment of money or performance of contracts; and on motion by Mr. Speed the leave asked for was referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Boon also moved for leave to report a bill, to be entitled, An act to compel plaintiffs and complainants, their agents or attorneys, to enter satisfaction of judgments and decrees upon the records thereof, when the same have been paid without execution; and on motion by Mr. Boon, the subject was referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. John W. Thomas obtained leave to report a bill, to be entitled, An act to repeal an act passed at Dec. session, 1825, incorporating a company to build a bridge across the river Susquehanna, at or near Havre-de-Grace; and Messrs. John W. Thomas, Tyson, Hope, Montgomery, Sutton, Harlan and Maffitt, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.

Mr. Tyson obtained leave to report a bill, to be entitled, An act relative to the acknowledging of deeds, and to examining femes covert as to their free assent to the same; and Messrs. Tyson, John W. Thomas, Campbell, Goldsborough and Barnes, were appointed a committee to prepare the same.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, Ordered, That a committee to consist of three members, be appointed by the speaker, to inquire into the expediency of amending the laws relating to the treasury department, with a view to the improvement and more efficient collection of the revenues of this state.

Whereupon, in compliance with the order, the Speaker announced the appointment of Messrs. Teackle, Chapman and Brooke, as the committee thereby authorised.

Mr. Tyson reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a society in the city of Baltimore, by the name of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the state of Maryland.

Mr. Reyner also reported a bill, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned. And Mr. Done also reported a bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of the lary court
