

Mr. Ridgaway moved for a call of the house; which motion was seconded by two other members. And on motion by Mr. Peach, the 27th rule of the house, requiring such call, was suspended in relation to the subject under consideration. Mr. Speed then moved, that the further consideration of said resolution be postponed until Monday next? Determined in the negative.

The resolution was then read a second time, debated, and dissented from.

Mr. Norris delivered the following report; which was read:

The committee, to whom was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, passed at December session eighteen hundred and fifteen, chapter forty eight, beg leave to report—that they have taken the same into consideration, and by referring to the act incorporating this company, your committee perceive that its charter is to be forfeited in eighteen hundred and thirty-one, unless twenty miles of the road therein mentioned, shall be completed by that period. As the time therefore for making the road has not elapsed, but a sufficiency remains unexpired for the completion of the work, according to the provisions of the original act, if proper exertions are made by the company, your committee respectfully recommend the rejection of the bill.
