

On motion by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on ways and means, it was Ordered, That the committee of claims, employ another printer to assist in printing the documents and reports, if they should deem it expedient.

Bills of the following titles were this day severally reported, viz.

By Mr. Hope, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace; and by Mr. Du Val, An act to regulate and organize the militia of this state.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

By Mr. Buchanan, An act for the relief of Henrietta S. Love, of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time, laid on the table, and made the order of the day for to-morrow.

Bills of the following titles were then read the second time, according to the rules of the house, severally passed, and sent to the senate for its concurrence, viz.

A bill reported by Mr. Brown, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Saterfield, of Caroline county.

And a bill reported by Mr. Norris, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth M. Brown, of Harford county.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act directing that the sense of the people of this state be taken on the expediency of calling a convention to reform the constitution, and for other purposes, was made the order of the day for Monday next the 22d instant.

On motion by Mr. Tidball, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act authorising commissions to be issued, to take the testimony of witnesses residing within this state, was made the order of the day for Wednesday next the 24th instant.

On motion by Mr. Denny, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act for the relief of the several counties of this state, was made the order of the day for Wednesday next the 24th instant.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act relative to the acknowledging and recording of deeds, and to examining femes covert as to their free as-
