

The bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate for concurrence.

The bill reported by Mr. Buchanan, chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, An act for the relief of Priscilla North, of Somerset county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate for concurrence.

Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee therein mentioned, delivered the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the bill received from the senate, entitled, An act to repeal an act, entitled, An act to repeal certain acts of assembly relative to amerciaments, and to lay a tax on plaintiffs who may institute actions at law in the several county courts of this state, have had the same under consideration, and report the same to the house with the following message:

Gentlemen of the Senate,
