So it was resolved in the affirmative; and the report was therefore concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, so amended, assented to.

According to the order of the day, the house proceeded to consider the bill, reported by Mr. Goldsborough, entitled. An act for the benefit of Thomas Brerewood and William C. Ridgeway, of Dorchester county, and after the same had been read the second time and the blank therein filled in with "one hundred and twenty dollars," on motion by Mr. Done, it was recommitted to the committee that reported it, for the purpose of amendment.

A message was received from the senate, by the clerk thereof, returning the bills of the following titles, viz.

An act to incorporate a mutual beneficial society, in the city of Baltimore, by the name of Saint Patrick's Society.

An act establishing a library for the use of the legislature; and,

An act to alter the time of holding the county courts, in Worcester and Somerset counties; severally endorsed, "will pass."

Also An act for the relief of Margaret Johns Key; and,
An act for the relief of Michael De Young of the city of Baltimore; severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment." The amendmensts were twice read, by special order, and severally assented to.

Also, a resolution, extending the time for commissioners, trustees and other authorities of the several literary institutions, in this state, to make reports, endorsed "assented to."

Whereupon, the said bills and resolution, were severally ordered to be engrossed.
