By Mr. Buchanan, the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying that a bridge may be built over the Great Falls of Gunpowder, on the Belle Air road; referred to Messrs. Buchanan, Price, Turner, Norris and Montgomery.

And the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore and Harford counties, praying that a bridge may be built over the Great Gunpowder Falls, on the Belle Air road; referred to the committee, above named, appointed to consider the last preceding petition.

By Mr. Gantt, the petition of Eleanor Beale, of Prince George's county, praying some pecuniary relief for herself and three infant children; referred to the committee on applications for pecuniary relief.

By Mr. Farquhar, the petition of John Truck, of Frederick county, praying further compensation for revolutionary services; referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

By Mr. Teackle, the petition of William Evans, and others, of Somerset county, praying to be admitted to the benefits of primary schools; referred to the committee on public instruction.

By Mr. Wilmer, the memorial of sundry citizens of Kent county, praying that the standard bushel of wheat and other grain, should be ascertained and fixed, and that an inquiry may be made into the legality of the proceedings of the mayor and city council of Baltimore, in relation thereto; referred to Messrs. Wilmer, Banning, Chapman, Sappington, Done, Stricker and Hall. And

By Mr. Tidball, a petition from the moderator and commissioners of Hager's town, praying for an act to authorize the levy of a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; referred to Messrs. Tidball, Hall and Newcomer.

On motion by Mr. Harlan, leave was granted the committee that prepared, and by him, as the chairman, reported the bill of the following title, to withdraw the same, viz.

An act to authorize the trustees of the poor of Cecil county, to purchase a farm or tract of land, for the use of the poor, and to sell the present alms house and the lands thereto belonging, of said county, and for other purposes.

Mr. Brooke asked and obtained leave to introduce a bill, to be entitled, An act for building a new prison in Calvert county, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Brooke, Somervell and Bourne, be a committee to prepare the same.
