XLVII. That the judges of the general court and justices of the county courts may appoint the clarks of their respective courts, and in case of resulal, death, resignation, disqualification, or removal out of the facts, or from their respective shores, of the clerks of the general court, or either of them, in the vacation of the said court, and in case of the resulal, death, resignation, disqualification, or removal out of the county, of any of the said county clerks, in the vacation of the county court of which he is clerk, the governous with the edvice of the council, may appoint and commission a at and proper person to such vacant office semission a at and proper person to such vacant office semission a season of the same until the executing of the past general court or county court, as the case may be

XLVIII. That the legislature shell never cress confluentmary jurisdiction for the trial of any sast in any civil case without a jury, except only in cases of small selec, or sivial wronge, not exceeding the sum or value of seven pounds ten shillings current money of this slate, or twenty dollars of the United States, or fines, serfeitures or penalties, not exceeding in value that sum, but the legislature may amend any desects in the stial by jury in civil cases; provided, that no verdictiall be made lawful, unless given by three seurchs, at least, or more, of the jury.
