of any office held by any other person, and then he does not held the same office in until or for the hearth of any other person.

Lill. That if any governor, chancellor, judge, register of wills, attorney-general, register of the land-office, commissioner of the loan-office, register of the land-office, commissioner of the loan-office, register of the chancery court, or any clerk of the common law courted treasurer, naval-officer, sherist, lurveyor, or auditor of public accounts, shall receive, directly or indirectly, at any time, the profits, or any part of the profits, of any office held by any other perion, during his estimation the office to which he is appointed, his election, expointment and commission, on conviction in a court of law by the oath of two credible withester, shall be void, and he shall suffer the punishment for wilful and correspt perjury, or be banished this state tur ever, or disqualished for ever from helding any office or place of trust or profit, as the court may adjudge.

LIV. That if any person shall give any bribe, pressent or reward, or any promise, or any security for that payment or delivery of any money, or any order thing; to obtain or procure a vote to be governor, sension, delegate to congress or assembly, member of the council, or judge, or to be appointed to any of the said effices, or to any office of profit or trust now created, or hereafter to be created in this state, the person giving and the person receiving the same, on conviction in a court of law, shall be say ever disqualished to hold may office of trust or profit in this state.

LV. That every person appointed to any office of profit or trast shall, before he enter on the executive thereof, take the following outh, to wit: "I, A. E.
