

of ground, and erect thereon a building fit and convenient for transacting the business of the said corporation.—*ibid.* § 16.

16. The said company, and their successors, are authorized to build erect and complete, a magazine for the storage and reception of gun-powder, at such convenient place as they shall think proper for the safety of the town, of capacity sufficient to answer the purpose of storing all such gun-powder as shall be brought to the said town of Baltimore by land or water, and securing the same from damage or injury, first obtaining the approbation of the owners of the land on which the same may be erected.—*ibid.* § 17.

17. As soon as the said magazine shall be ready for the reception of gun-powder, and 14 days notice thereof given in the news-papers, no person or persons shall keep or have in his, her or their possession, within the limits of the town of Baltimore, or the precincts thereof, any quantity of gun-powder exceeding 30lb. (except in the magazine) under the penalty of 10l. current money, and forfeiture of the whole.—*ibid.* § 18.

18. If any gun-powder so deposited in the magazine, be intended for exportation, it shall not be delivered on board of the vessel intended to export the same (over and above the quantity of 30lb.) whilst she remains at any wharf within the town and its precincts, but shall be conveyed from the said magazine in a boat well covered up and secured with a sail, canvas or cloth, over the powder in such boat laden, nor shall it be lawful for any boat, used as aforesaid in the carriage and embarkation of gun-powder to lay at any wharf within the said town, or its precincts with the powder on board, under the penalty of 10l. current money, and the forfeiture of the boat and powder therein contained.—*ibid.* § 19.

19. All gunpowder brought and conveyed to the said town of Baltimore, or its precincts, or within the limits thereof, over and above 30lb. by any person or persons whatsoever, on land, shall be carried and delivered immediately to the magazine aforesaid, within the hours hereinafter prescribed for attendance of said magazine under the penalty of forfeiting at and after the rate of 10l. current money for every cask or barrel not delivered to the magazine as above directed, and a forfeiture of the whole.—*ibid.* § 20.

20. No person or persons shall convey in any boat, waggon, dray or other carriage, or in any other manner whatsoever, any quantity of gun-powder over and above 30lb. weight, in or through the town or precincts of Baltimore, until the same is first secured and covered in a good bag or bags, or putting a sheet, sail or other cloth, under and around it, so as effectually to prevent the same from scattering or sifting out, under the penalty of 10l. current money for every cask, and forfeiture of the whole as aforesaid.—*ibid.* § 21.
