

21. Any justice of the peace for the county of Baltimore is required, as often as he shall be informed, upon oath, of probable cause to suspect any person or persons to conceal or keep, within the said town or its precincts any quantity of gun-powder over and above 30lb. weight, to issue a search warrant to examine into the truth of such allegation or suspicion, and to search any place whatever therein.---*ibid.* § 21.

22. All the fines, penalties and forfeitures, in this act mentioned, shall and may be recovered in any court aforesaid in this state, with costs of suit, by action of debt or bill of indictment or information, to be applied towards the expence of paving and repairing of the streets of Baltimore town.---*ibid.* § 23.

23. The said company, and their successors and representatives, shall keep a superintendant or keeper of the said magazine; who shall be ready to attend the same every day (Sundays excepted) from the hours of 9 in the morning until 2 o'clock in the afternoon, and receive all gun-powder delivered to be stored (on payment of the sum hereafter mentioned) and give a receipt for the same, mentioning the mark and number thereof.---*ibid.* § 24.

24. The said company, and their successors, shall receive the following storage for all powder delivered at the magazine aforesaid, to wit: 5s. current money for 1 barrel, and so in proportion for half barrel and quarter barrel, with liberty of keeping the same in the said magazine 1 year for the said price, one half to be paid at the delivery and the other half at the re-delivery thereof.---*ibid.* § 25.

25. The said company shall be accountable to the owners of the powder so stored for the same, unless injured or destroyed from any providential or unavoidable accident.---*ibid.* § 26.

26. All powder manufactured at the manufactory of Messrs. Robert Gilmor, & Co. Stephen Wilson, and others, and belonging to the proprietors thereof, and stored in the powder-house aforesaid, shall be stored at half the rates hereinbefore directed.---*ibid.* § 27.

27. The said company shall have the regulation of the chimney sweepers within the said town and precincts, and, from time to time, to ascertain the reward to be paid to them for their services, and to establish badges and regulations respecting the same; and no person shall sweep or clean any chimney, within the limits thereof, for hire or pay without a licence first obtained from the said fire company: provided, that the rate for a chimney of one story shall not exceed 1s. and for two or more stories 18d.---*ibid.* § 28.

28. The president and trustees, are authorised to issue a licence or licences, to any person or persons, for the better sweeping of chimnies
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
