C H A P. I.

An ACT for the service of Almighty God, and the establishment of the protestant religion in this province. Lib. LL. fol. 1. Lib. WH and L. fol. 1. and Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 2. Repealed 1696, ch. 18.

C H A P. II.

C H A P. III.

C H A P. IV.

An ACT against divulgers of false news. Lib. LL. fol. 24. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 140. Repealed 1700, ch. 8.

C H A P. V.

An ACT for naturalization. Lib. LL. fol. 46. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 141.

C H A P. VI.

A Supplementary act to the act for settlement of an annual revenue upon their majesties governor within this province for the time being. Lib. LL. fol. 27. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 142.

C H A P. VII.

An ACT for securing the rights of several persons. Lib. LL. fol. 28. Lib. WH and L. fol. 12. and Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 6. Repealed 1704, ch. 77, but the rights acquired under it saved.

C H A P. VIII.

An ACT for appeals, and regulating writs of error. Lib. LL. fol. 32. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 18. Repealed 1694, ch. 18.

C H A P. IX.

An ACT for the easement of the inhabitants of this province in suits at law for small debts. Lib. LL. fol. 37. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 84. Repealed 1700, ch. 8.
