BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the collection of the treble tax, which nonjurors are liable to pay on the tax imposed by the act, entitled, (c) An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine, shall be and is hereby suspended until the end of the present session of this general assembly, any thing to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.
