

XXIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the money shall be paid immediately on the service done, at the rate herein before specified, and the registers in chancery and court of admiralty respectively shall, every half year, pay the same to the treasurer of the western shore, for the use of the public, and shall annually lay before the general assembly a fair account of their receipts, and shall be allowed a commission of ten per cent. in full for their trouble and service in the execution of this act.

XXIV. This act to continue until the first day of November next, and until the end of the next session which shall happen thereafter.

Continued for one year, &c. (except the 17th, 20th and 21st sessions,) by October, 1780, ch. 23, which continuing act was continued for one year, &c. by November, 1781, ch. 7, and to the first of October, 1783, &c. by November, 1782, ch. 31. The act of October, 1780, ch. 23, was declared to be revived and continued for one year by November, 1783, ch. 30, and for three years, &c. by 1784, ch. 83. By November, 1787, ch. 36, the act of 1779, ch. 25, and the continuing act of October, 1780, ch. 23, were continued to the end of the next November session. By November, 1788, ch. 47, they were continued to the end of the next November session. The act of November, 1779, ch. 25, was continued by 1789, ch. 52, the act of November, 1788, ch. 47, by 1789, ch. 57, and the act of October, 1780, ch. 23, by 1789, ch. 58, each to 30th October, 1790, &c. By 1790, ch. 59, the acts of November, 1779, ch. 25, and October, 1780, ch. 23, (the title of which last act is there misquoted,) were continued to 30th October, 1797, &c. by 1797, ch. 116, (a general continuing act,) to first November, 1798, &c. by 1798, ch. 175, the act of November, 1779, ch. 25, and October, 1780, ch. 23, and the act of 1790, ch. 59, (as far as it relates to poundage fees allowed to the sheriffs,) are continued to 30th October, 1805, &c.
