C H A P. II.

Passed 27th of
June, 1781.

An ACT to repeal the several acts of assembly heretofore made relative to the export of provisions. Lib. TBH. No. A. fol. 2.

Acts repealed.

BE IT ENACTED, *by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all acts of assembly heretofore made, prohibiting the export of provisions, shall be and are hereby repealed, (except so much of the said acts as forbids the export of provisions of the meat kind by water, which shall continue and remain in full force during the time limited by said acts, or any of them, any thing herein to the contrary notwithstanding.)
