XXXIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That on the arrival of any ship or other vessel in harbour, or in any river in the view of any naval-officer, such naval-officer shall give notice to the assessor in the hundred next adjoining, and such assessor shall proceed to value the same agreeable to the directions of this act.

XXXIV. AND, whereas many ships and other vessels arrive at the port of Baltimore, so that it may be necessary to empower the commissioners of the tax to nominate an additional assessor, BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the tax for that county shall and are hereby required to nominate an additional assessor at Baltimore-town, who shall assist in doing the duty incumbent on the assessors of that hundred already directed by this act.

XXXV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the collector or his deputy shall, on the request of any person charged, or on the request of any person offering to pay for any person charged, shew to the person so applying the certificate given by the commissioners of such charge, and if required, give him a copy thereof; and if it shall appear to any collector, that any person shall reside in any other hundred of his county than that in which his property shall be valued, it is hereby declared to be the duty of such collector to enter such assessment under the hundred where such person shall reside; and if it shall appear to any collector, that any person whose property shall be valued in his county shall not reside therein, it is hereby declared to be the duty of such collector to make diligent inquiry where such person shall live, and he shall, if known, transmit to the collector of the county where such person shall reside a copy of the valuation made on the property of such person in his county, and such collector, on receipt thereof, shall enter the same under the hundred where such person shall reside, and collect the same.

XXXVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid shall and may divide their respective counties into convenient districts, containing not less than one or more than three entire hundreds; and the said collector, with the approbation of the commissioners, shall appoint a deputy in each district, for whom he shall be answerable.

XXXVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners shall, on or before the first day of April next, make out and deliver to the collector an alphabetical list of the persons in each hundred chargeable for the property therein, the amount of the valuation of each person's property respectively, as returned by the assessors, or as corrected by them, expressing the sum to be paid thereon by this act.

XXXVIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every person shall, on or before the first day of June next, pay to the collector of the county, or his deputy of the district where his property was valued, one half part of the assessment imposed by this act, or he may, in discharge thereof, pay any of the articles following; that is to say, good fresh merchantable pork, delivered before the first day of March next, well fatted on corn, and each hog exceeding ninety pounds weight, at forty shillings per hundred; good beef on the hoof, adding the fifth quarter to the weight of the net beef, at thirty-three shillings and four-pence per hundred; good merchantable barrelled pork, containing at least two hundred and twenty pounds of net pork, at six pounds per barrel; good merchantable wheat, weighing not less than fifty-eight pounds per bushel, at seven shillings and six-pence per bushel; good, sweet, fresh, merchantable fine wheat flour, and packed in strong seasoned barrels, at eighteen shillings and nine-pence for each short hundred weight, with allowance of three shillings for the barrel and nails; transfer tobacco, inspected since the first day of September last, at eighteen shillings and nine-pence per hundred; crop tobacco, inspected since the first day of April last, in hogheads weighing not less than nine hundred and fifty net, at twenty-two shillings and six-pence per hundred, with an allowance of four per cent. for the cask; or bar iron at thirty pounds per tun.

XXXIX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the bills of credit emitted by act of assembly in the month of May last shall be taken in payment of the assessment imposed by this act at the rate of one dollar for seven shillings and six-pence current money; and any of the state continental bills of credit emitted in the month of June, seventeen hundred and eighty, shall be received in payment of the assessment aforesaid, at the rate of three dollars for seven shillings and six-pence current money; and any
