

- VI. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That a sum not exceeding ten thousand pounds current money be appropriated to the execution of this act, and that military stores and provisions for rations be furnished out of the public magazines and stores.
- VII. AND,** to procure the said money, **BE IT ENACTED,** That two thousand pounds, arising from the late sales of confiscated British property, and now or daily expected to be paid to the commissioners for the sales of such property, be paid by them to the commissioners appointed to fit out the said galley and barges.
- VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, be authorized and directed to confirm the sales heretofore made of certain lots on Whetstone Point to the first purchasers, if they will make their first payment within fifteen days after notice, and, in case of their default, to the second purchasers, if they will make their first payment within five days after the expiration of the said fifteen days, and, upon default, the said commissioners may sell the same upon the terms expressed for selling certain confiscated British property by the act of last session of assembly, to raise recruits, and the said commissioners are directed to give notice to the said purchasers as soon as possible, and to call on such purchasers of lots on Whetstone Point who have made their first to make their second payment.
- IX. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That the said commissioners be authorized and directed to sell at auction, after two weeks notice, certain lots of confiscated British property in Baltimore-town, or other unappropriated British property, on the terms in the act to raise recruits, passed last session, to the amount of one thousand pounds current money; provided, that no property be sold for less than the last assessment thereof.
- X. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That all money received since the first day of May last, or which shall be received before the first day of January next, for land warrants, or for composition on certificates, and the money to become due on the third payments for British property sold in virtue of the act to raise recruits, shall be applied, so far as may be necessary, to the execution of this act.
- XI. AND,** if there should be any deficiency, **BE IT ENACTED,** That the intendant be authorized and directed to sell such of the specifics as he may judge most advantageous to the public, to make up such deficiency.
- XII. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That if any officer, seaman, waterman or marine, shall lose a limb, or be otherwise maimed or hurt, so as to be rendered incapable of procuring a livelihood, such officer, seaman, waterman or marine, shall be entitled to receive the same provision and support, as is or shall hereafter be established by this state for its officers and soldiers in the service of the United States.
- XIII. AND,** to prevent masters of vessels and others from enticing any seaman, waterman or marine, to leave the service of this state, **BE IT ENACTED,** That if any person shall persuade or entice any seaman, waterman or marine, to leave the service of this state, such person, on conviction thereof in the general or any county court, shall forfeit fifty pounds current money; and if any master or mate of any vessel shall hire or entertain, or conceal, or endeavour to conceal, any seaman, waterman or marine, entered in the service of this state, knowing him to belong to such service, such master or mate, on conviction thereof before the governor and the council, or any one of the judges of the general court, or any two justices of the peace, shall forfeit twenty pounds current money; and if any seaman, or other person employed on board any vessel, shall entertain or conceal, or endeavour to conceal, any seaman, waterman or marine, entered in the service of the state, and knowing him to belong to such service, such person, convicted thereof as aforesaid, shall thereupon be deemed as entered in the service of the state for three years as a seaman, waterman or marine, and receive wages as such.
- XIV. AND,** for the encouragement of the officers and soldiers of the said barges and galley or other vessel of force, **BE IT ENACTED,** That any prizes or booty taken by them from the enemy, shall be divided among the captors in such proportion as regulated in like cases by congress.
- XV. AND,** until a sufficient number of men can be procured by enlistment, **BE IT ENACTED,** That such number of the recruits lately enlisted in this state, as the honourable major-general Smallwood shall think fit for the service, and can be spared, be employed on board the said barges and galley or vessel
