

City Annapolis December 17<sup>th</sup> 1803

Whereas Moses Webb of Baltimore County has been committed to the gaol on a charge of breaking open the store of William D. McKim, and taking therefrom three hundred and thirty dollars, and whereas it appears to me by a representation from a number of respectable Inhabitants of Baltimore and the said William D. McKim, that the said Moses Webb has heretofore maintained the Character of an upright and honest man and is in their opinion worthy the interposition of the Executive authority in his favor, and in as much as three hundred and fifteen dollar have been found and confessed to be the property of the said McKim and the residue paid by his father, I do therefore order and direct that all proceedings at Law against the said Moses Webb do cease and determine, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of the same.
