County greeting. Whereas Negro Perry otherwise called
Peregrine the proper slave of a certain Elizabeth Rochester
Negro John otherwise called John Armstrong - negro
Cato, the proper slave of a certain Joseph Judler and
negro Will otherwise called negro William the proper slave
of a certain Elizabeth Rochester have been indicted arraigned
and found guilty of murder, and by the Justices of the
County Court Judicially sitting at Centreville in and
for the said County on the third Monday in October
being the sixteenth day of the same month, in the year
of our Lord one Thousand eight Hundred and nine,
were sentenced to be hanged by the neck untill they
be dead - there are therefore to will and require as also
to charge and command you that on Wednesday the
Twentieth day of November Instant you take the
said John otherwise called John Armstrong, Negro
Perry otherwise called Peregrine, Negro Cato and neg-
ro Will otherwise called negro William from your prison
