the same from day to day as may be judged necessary
and I hereby command the Sheriff of the said County
that on the said day or any other day that he shall
be required by the said Court he cause to come before the
Court as well the said Prisoners and their attachments
as all other Prisoners and their attachments. In
Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and caused the Great Seal of the State of Maryland
to be affixed to these Presents this Twentieth day
of November in the Year of our Lord one Thousand

A Proclamation

Whereas it has been represented to me by James Mc Gill, on
Oath, that in the morning of the Thirteenth Instant, he had
a Tobacco House with a quantity of Tobacco, and a variety
of farming utensils, consumed by fire, and that he believes
that some wicked or evil disposed person or persons set fire
to the same: And whereas it is of the greatest importance to
society that the perpetrator or perpetrators of such a crime
should be brought to justice, I have therefore thought proper
to issue this my proclamation, and do, by and with the advice
and consent of the Council, offer a reward of Two Hundred
Dollars to whoever will discover the author or perpetrators
of the said offence, provided he, she or they, or any of
them, be convicted thereof. And moreover I do, by virtue
of the authority and power vested in me, hereby pardon
a full and complete pardon to any person being an accomplice
