

The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Queen Anne County greeting  
Whereas negro Perry otherwise called Peregrine the proper slave  
of a certain Elizabeth Rochester has been indicted arraigned and  
found guilty of Murder, and by the Justice of the County Court  
Judicially sitting at Centreville in and for the said County on the  
third Monday in October being the sixteenth day of the same month,  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine,  
was sentenced to be hanged by the neck until he be dead -  
There are therefore to will and require as also to charge and command  
you that on Friday the twelfth day of January Instant you take  
the said negro Perry otherwise called Peregrine from your prison  
and him safely convey to the Gallows in the county aforesaid the  
common place of execution of Malefactors and there on or before  
twelve of the clock on the said day the said negro Perry  
hang by the neck on the said Gallows until he be dead - for  
all which this shall be your sufficient power and authority -  
Given under my hand and the seal of the State of Maryland  
this ninth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and ten
