Was then taken into consideration the way & manner of dealing
with the Susquehannock Indians & the rest of the northern
Indians, & of concluding a peace with them. It was
unanimously concluded that Col Henry Courfey one of the
council should be employed as Ambassador or Envoy to be sent
to New York by the way of New Castle upon Delaware to that
purpose according to the tenor of Commission & Instructions so
handed him quenched this day, the Commission signed by the
Governor & sealed with the great Seal of this Province, the
Instructions also signed by the Governor & sealed with his
Lordly & lesser Seals at a time, & are both expressed as
followeth.

a long contention betwixt the said Indians Subjects residing within this
Province under the Government of his said Lord^r as well as
