

The said Susquehannockes have hitherto & lately desired to come  
to a treaty of Peace with his said Lordps & since I am informed  
since the said ventur'd submitted themselves to putt themselves  
under the protection of the Sennoyes or some other Nation of Indians  
residing to the Northward of this Province & within or near unto the  
Territories of his <sup>Royall</sup> Majesty the Duke of Yorke know you that I have  
constituted ordain'd appointed & authorized as I doe hereby consti-  
ordain'd appoint & authorize Henry Coursey Esq<sup>r</sup> one of his Lordps  
Council for this Province as Embassadour or Envoy to be sent with  
& conclude a firme Peace with the said Susquehannockes Sennoyes  
or any other Indians now unknown to us inhabiting or residing  
to the Northward of us within or without the Territories of his  
said Royall Majesty & from whom we have already received  
injury or may hereafter reasonably suspect we may receive  
injury by the confederacy between them & the said Susquehannockes  
upon such reasonable termes as to him shall seem meet and  
convenient according to his Instructions And I am sure as the  
said Indians doe now reside for the most part within the Territory  
of his said Royall Majesty or at least cannot be treated with but  
by a journey to be had through his said Majesty's Territory I doe hereby  
constitute ordain'd appoint & authorize the said Henry Coursey to treat  
with Edmond Andros Esq<sup>r</sup> Seigneur of Sausarrez Lieut<sup>e</sup> & Governour  
Gen<sup>l</sup> under his Royall Majesty James Duke of York & Albany  
of all his Territories in America & to desire leave to passe through  
the said Territory under his Governour's so the treaty with the  
Indians aforesaid & to request his Assistance in the procuring of a  
firme Peace for all his Ma<sup>ty</sup>s Subjects in his Ma<sup>ty</sup>s Colony of  
Virginia as well as for those of this Province with the Indians aforesaid  
wherefore I doe request that the aforesaid Henry Coursey (according  
to the Law of Nations) may be received credited & believed  
promising to Ratifie confirm & approve whatsoever shall be done  
by him in the premises according to the my Commission as if it were  
done by my selfe Given at S<sup>t</sup> Maryes under my hand & the great  
Seale of this Province this thirtieth day of April in the second  
year of his Lordps Dominion Anno Domini 1677
