Whereas the Govern<sup>r</sup> & Council are informed that there  
are severall persons that are seated within this Province on  
the Sea coast. And do pretend to be under the Government  
of New York. It is therefore ordered that a Speciall  
warrant be granted to Mr William Storer for Right  
Thousand Acres of Land to be proportioned out by him  
for the Encouragement of such as will seat there on the  
said Sea coast. And that such persons as seat there  
shall have seven years Liberty to make Good Rights for  
the said Land paying to the Treas<sup>r</sup> America Rent  
of two shillinges more yearly for every hundred Acres  
And further it is ordered that those that seat nearest  
the Houkulls shall have out of the said 10000 one  
thousand Acres of Land to a family having in it three  
working hands at the least. The Rest of the 10000  
Acres to be proportioned out at 500 Acres to a family  
having in it two working hands at the least. Provide  
such as intend to seat there shall settle within this  
time and the last of November next. There being and  
not before their plantations. And it is further  
ordered that at the Return of Pet<sup>r</sup> Henry Courser  
from New York a Letter be sent to the Govern<sup>r</sup>  
of New York to know whether those persons who stand  
introduced upon his Treas<sup>r</sup> Province be liable  
for their Govern<sup>r</sup> what there may be claim understand  
ing betwixt the two Govern<sup>r</sup>s
