and fifty pounds of lawful Merchantable Tobacco in stuffe, and five
barrells of good sound Indian corn, to be payd the tenth day of
November next ensuing the date hereof, likewise Francis Pope
doe bynd my oore for his security, and am not to dispose of it but
by the sayd Robert Clarkes satisfaction, witnesses my hand this eighteenth of
March one thousand six hundred forty six

Richard Cop made his will in his last sickness: being the 4th of September
being the day before he died: in manner following by word of
mouth: I do give and bequeath unto Anthony Rawling, all my roots
now growing, with all the grass lands and perryngs, that he is
the field: I do further give unto my son, Anthony four hundred
pounds of Tobacco, due unto me from Septimus Tho: Cornwallis as a debt
of mine from the sayd Septimus and his assigns: I do bequeath
