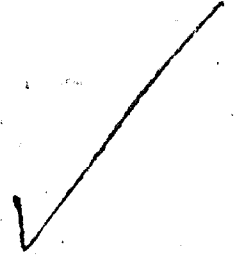

The oath of Capt. J. Dine taken in open Assembly 29 Feb. 1647.

This Dep. saith that he perceiveth m. Blount has a great charge incurred since
payd. The m. Blount replied that charge should be paid out of his own effects &
his Lt's estate, & if it would not be sufficient, he would engage for it: as was
of his Lt's estate.

Walter Pakes deposeth in open Assembly that one Elias Beaul delivring to m. Blount
Blount in price of this Dep. if he would depart for fear of great charges for
paym. of Soldiers wages, like to light upon the Country. To whom m. Blount replied that
his own estate, & his Brothers should pay of Soldiers, & if now other charge should come
upon the Country, more than 60. Lib. a bythead: & further add. saying, if it
was done I will engage his Lt's Country for satisfaction of 50. Soldiers.

Leif. Wile. deans deposeth in open Assembly that he hath heard m. Blount
say words to this effect. Whences he found it necessary to maintain such a charge
in defence of the p. of his Lt's estate in the p. could not detract of charge by own
share: & if it would not, he would engage his Lt's province.

Wile. whole deposeth in open Assembly that he heard m. Blount say to the
effect, & his own estate should go towards the paym. of the Soldiers, & if it were not
sufficient he would engage the province. And in the same he, m. Blount
agreed as the Soldiers to take. Pines in self, or calves by their side at 50. Lib. of
600. Lib. & heighfours in self, or calves by their side at 500. Lib. towards their
wages.
