I have received you his of 2 past: Besides what is upon you...  
never saw him since, I had notice from him made 70 £ and pounds. I desire  
will write to you Mr. Stone, & upon his information, will be what is due...  
by gods help make you satisfaction. I have bene in great care of the bond. But the  
last year when I thought to have gone to London, I had all my goods taken from  
by Beckett & Vice. Admirall of Cornwal. w<sup>ch</sup> though I should have desired, by him I  
is not left. for I had order from the King to stop his proceedings. And if I should  
troublesome, I could not travel to make an end of the business. But the goods  
in his hands, in a house whereof he hath one key, & another. By reason whereof  
was forced to come over once more provided, & a little goods I had, was forced to  
for hire of a ship I came over in, whereof I have not any thing left worth  
of. &c. your loving friend to command
