That he took up at y<sup>e</sup> time from among y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. cattle, a heigher of about two years old, brownish p<sup>er</sup>ed, as he remembereth, marked w<sup>th</sup> a flower-de-lis in each year, made by direct lines; but the one ear had not soe punctually y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. mark, belonging unto Rob<sup>t</sup>. Smith. & having remained at S<sup>t</sup>. Maries aforesaid some good considerable time, w<sup>th</sup> out being claymed, by any other, but he heard of. It was, this deft<sup>s</sup> fortune to see y<sup>e</sup> heigher at Walter Beanes, some months ago, who informing himselfe to whom y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. heigher then belonged, it was answered him, that shee did belong to y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. Walter Beane. & thereupon y<sup>e</sup> deft<sup>s</sup> certified y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Rob<sup>t</sup>. Justices, & estate were then actually under exco<sup>m</sup>un. & likewise a pecke of y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. George Mannars out of M<sup>r</sup>. Shurmans house. went to y<sup>e</sup> Sheriffe of Kent, ret. Novemb<sup>r</sup>. Court next.
