I Peter Mackerell being weak in Body, but perfect in memory ...
be all mightly God, doe here make & ordaine my last will & Testament ...
mer & fame following. First I commit, commend & bequeath my soule into the
hands of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ, by whose merits, death & passion I
hope to enjoy part of his blessed resurrection, & to be made an Inhabitant of the
everlasting ioyes of heaven. And I bequeath my Body to be buried, wheresoever
it shall please the discretion of my Executors. And for all
my worldly goods to be disposed of as followeth all my debts being fully
paid & satisfied. First I give unto Thomas Deniard & John Thimbleby Eight hundred
of next value, four hundred two hundred, six shillings, one pence & Bolster, & a
barren goose. Also I give to J^r. Thimbleby & Thomas Deniard my house &
plantation, & all other things, which do belong unto mee, my former part, but axes &
hoes, & one pebble, two yokes, one yoke & all of value I have both goods
with, & chattels: making J^r. Thimbleby & Tho. Deniard my Executors
of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand the 3rd day of Aprile in the 23rd year of the reign of our Sovereign
L^o. Charles by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France, & Ireland, King, Defender
of the Faith &c. Anno Domini 1645.
