properly belonging to J. Munday. And specially he sayth J. he never knew Edw. Hudson
bring any flesh into J. house of Thos. Munday, though frequently hee went into J. woods
to kill one. And further he sayth, J. he knoweth not of any private place, either
abroad, or at home, whereon meat was hid.

Edward Clenton sayth upon his oath, J. Edw. Hudson did shoot a fayer sow of
Brent's, upon J. Land of J. M. Brent on J. of Kent, about 3 weeks ago. & by
report of J. gun, he this Dept. came up to him, & saw J. Hudson, sett his dog upon
J. sow. And afterwards hee him cutt J. throat of J. sow. And then M. Brent's
folke coming in, upon J. report of J. gun, & by cry of J. sow. J. Hudson, led J.
sow in a marsh. And this Dept. went home wth Hudson to Thos. Munday's house. Where
J. Dept. heard of J. Hudson, tell of J. Munday, J. he had killed a sow, & J. M. Brent's
came to him, & inquired & sought, what hee had killed. But for any thing hee knew, J.
sow was not found. And next morning after day, J. Munday spoke to this Dept. to
fetch J. sow home to J. Munday's house. who went out; But Hudson went, & came
home, & J. sow was there. And J. next night J. Dept. & Hudson brought J. sow
to a branch of a tree near Brunnes. where J. Munday & J. Goncar, &
appointed to make them, to help to bring J. sow home. Munday came not, but J.
Goncar came, & carried one halfe of J. sow, to J. Munday's house. where J. Munday
