Thomas War demanded 300 acres of Land for transporting himself & his wife & two children into this province, this year 1648.

want to survey to lay out 300 acres Land, on the South side of S. Charles River & to return certificate upon first Novemb.

These presents witness that I have given unto Mr. Coxes two Children, Elizabeth Cox, & will^m Cox, two Cows, & their calves, one of them a Cow calf, now appointed, & numbered out for them, & by me set to their use, into the hands of Tho: Greene Esq^r to the intents following. All the female cowcalfes with the two Cows to be preserved & kept up for a stock, for the children, until either of them shall be fifteen years of age, & all the age of the first Elizabeth, after the death of the first Will^m to have their equal share of the female cattle, delivered up, by the first Tho: Greene Esq^r or his assignes into her, & his hands. If either of the children shall chance to dye before the age of the first Elizabeth, then their part of the female cattle to goe to the other child. But if both shall dye, then all the female cattle to be returned againe to my self, my exors or admorsors, or my assignes heires. The first Tho: Greene, & his assignes to have the female cattle, & milk for keeping of the stock for the children, & for keeping the children; with his receiving of the cattle to that use, he or they shall be bound to do if at any time they shall want other maintenance. But if on notice of their such want given, the first Tho: Greene or his assignes shall not be willing to maintain the children; then he shall put the female cattle into the hands of the first Mary Brent, to their maintenance. Or in case of their death, or absence into such hands, as the Provinciall Court of this province of Maryland shall appoint for maintenance of the children. June 30th 1648. per me Signed Giles Brent
