

of Jn. Hilliard to bring a Certificate from some Magistrate in Virginia
to Jn. Hilliard had made oath before him, that he had read to Jn. Hilliard
his knowledge acquitted Jn. Hilliard from Jn. Hilliard's debt. And Jn. Hilliard
affirmed that Jn. Hilliard would not take his oath concerning the matter.
Whereupon the Court admitted Robt. Percy to his oath, who deposed in these
words That Jn. Hilliard being Prisoner at Popes Court, Jn. Hilliard told
him that he had a Bill of his, w^{ch} he would freely forgive him
affirming moreover, that in what Country he should meet him, he would
not offer him for it. & further sayth, that Jn. Hilliard told him, that
he had taken some goods out of his (the Depts) Chamber.

The Jury returned their Verdict in writing. Found by the Jury for
the Deft. And the Court commended it, to be entered for the Judgment.

In ca^{se} supra George Manners sayth upon his oath, that being at Ap-
pamattock. Jn. Hilliard came to this Dept. desiring him, to be his Attor-
ney, for to recover a Bill due to him of 500. Tob. (as this Dept. remem-
bereth from M^r. Percy. Whereupon this Dept. made him answer, that he had for-
merly heard of the Bill, & that he had spoken to M^r. Percy about it. And
how M^r. Percy told this Dept. that Jn. Hilliard had forgiven him the debt.
And Hilliard replied, saying, was true, that Jn. Hilliard would forgive him,
because I had heard, that he (to wit) M^r. Percy had hidden the Treasurers plate,
w^{ch} I thought he would have told me of, he being to goe out of the Country,
but he telling me, no such thing, therefore I desired you to sue for my
debt. And further he sayth out.

Anthony Rawlins sayth upon his oath, That M^r. Clarke did pro-
mise this Dept. to pay him of some quantity in Tob. as this Dept. should
pay, for a Barrell of Corn, w^{ch} this Dept. recovered of Jn. Hilliard
by order of Court in Aprile last.

John Few aged 21 years or thereabouts (at the request of Cuth. Hen-
cock Gent.) sayth upon his oath. That of two w^{ch} Jn. Holloway carry-
ed from P^r. Maines to Appamattock for the use of M^r. Specker of Chescon
(w^{ch} was due from his Leg^{ty}) was marked wth an hollow Copp in one ear
(w^{ch} ear this Dept. knoweth not) The other ear whether it hath been
or forked, he knoweth not, the under part of the ear being gone: but
of them it was. And further he sayth out.
