Ceciliae Lrd Prop^{ri} of Mary Land &c: To all y^e persons to whom these parts shall come Greeting.
Know ye that wee for & in consideration of John Nunne of this province of Mary Land Plant^{er} hath transported himselfe into o^r province, in 9 years past to plant & inhabit there. And by and of J^r John Nunne may be called to doo unto us, & o^r heires acceptable service in o^r province. Hence of & by advice of J^r Driffy Tho: Greene Esq^r Left^t Justice of o^r province. And according to the tenor of o^r Letters under o^r hand & Seale, bearing date at Ports-mouth in the Reuleme of England & of Ang^l 1636, & enrolled by o^r Secretary of o^r province: Given & Granted, And by these parts doe give grant & effect, unto J^r John Nunne All the parcels of Land lying & situate in Breton Bay. Bounded on the North w^{ch} J^r Bay, on the West w^{ch} J^r Land now possessed of Will^m Affier on the South w^{ch} J^r Land now in the possession of Will^m Brown & the Northmost Edge of a Huckle-berry swamp; one of East w^{ch} a line of marked Trees drawn South from a marked Oake in Bretons Bay, called Nunns-Oake, until it falleth into J^r forest swamp. Conteyning & now layd out for 300 Acres more or lesse. And also woods, quays, mines (Royall mines excepted) waters, fishing, fishing-places, And all other profits & commodities in or upon J^r Land. Saving to us & o^r heires o^r Royall Jurisdiction, & Signorie as absolute Lords Prop^{ri} of o^r province. To have & to hold of J^r same unto him J^r John Nunne, & his heires for ever. To be holden of us, as of o^r maner of New Towne, in free & common socage by fealty only, for all services yielding & paying therefor yearly, at o^r usuall Receipt at S^t M^ries three shillings in money Sterling, or three Bushells of good Corn at J^r Market of o^r Land. Given at S^t J^r Gregors fort this 11th day of Octob^r. Anno 1647. Witness o^r J^r Left^t Justice.

(as appeared by the Letters of Patent of J^r Land, under o^r Seale of o^r province unto him J^r John Nunne bearing date at S^t J^r Gregors fort 11th day of October 1647) by estimation
