

in case they stand in need thereof & that they lett his  
 Lordship knowe wherein he can doe them any good there  
 in recompence of their sufferings of wch his L<sup>ty</sup> is very  
 sensible & that they assure them on his L<sup>ty</sup> be helpe  
 that he will continue his utmost endeavours (by solliciting  
 his Highnesse & Councell for the procuring of Justice to  
 be don them for the lives of their husbands & satisfaction  
 for their lyes from those who have don them so great  
 Injuries w<sup>ch</sup> he doubts not but will be at last obtained.

5. That they cherish & comfort in what they can all such  
 persons as have approved themselves faithfull to his L<sup>ty</sup>  
 and don good service in the late troubles there: that  
 his L<sup>ty</sup> said Lieu: preferre those persons before any others  
 to such places & imployments of trust & profit as they may  
 be respectively capable of & in particular Mr Thomas Truman  
 Mr George Thomson Lieu: Thomas Funnell & Mr Barton & that  
 his said Lieu: & Councell lett his L<sup>ty</sup> understand from time  
 to time wherein he can upon any occasion requite them &  
 others who have bin faithfull to his L<sup>ty</sup> as aforesaid w<sup>th</sup>  
 any thing there for their advantage according to their  
 respective merits assuring them that his L<sup>ty</sup> will be very  
 ready & willing to gratify them in any thing that shall be  
 reasonably desired of him & in his power to doe.

6. That whereas a Windmill att St Marys wh was formerly be-  
 longing to Maior Gen: Edward Gibbons late deceased was assign-  
 ned by the said Gibbons his Widdow to his L<sup>ty</sup> in satisfacti-  
 on of adelt of one hundred pounds Ster: due to his L<sup>ty</sup>  
 from the said Maior Gibbons His L<sup>ty</sup> requires his said Lieu:  
 and Councell to take speciall care that the said Mill be pre-  
 served & improved to the best advantage for his Lordships  
 use & benefitt.

7. That they doe take speciall care that no encroachments  
 be made by any upon any part of his L<sup>ty</sup> said Province  
 for the better prevention whereof his L<sup>ty</sup> requires his said  
 Lieu: & Councell to cause the Bounds thereof to be kept in  
 memory & notoriously knowne especially the bounds betwene  
 Maryland & Virginia on that part of the Country knowne  
 there by the name of the Easterne shore to w<sup>ch</sup> purpose  
 his L<sup>ty</sup> would have them peruse one of the Maps of Mary-  
 land w<sup>ch</sup> his L<sup>ty</sup> formerly sent thither whereby the said bounds  
 are described & his L<sup>ty</sup> hath also for these directions herein  
 sent here with a copy of a Proclamation published here to-  
 fore by the then Govern<sup>r</sup> & Councell of Virginia for prohi-  
 biting any of Virginia to trade with the Indians in
