 a day to be by you limited in the said Commission, And is
 promissed an act of Chancery for the punishing of such as
 shall counterfeit the said Coyn, or otherwise offend in
 that behalf, according to the form of an Act therein
 contained by me last year to my Governour and Secre-
 tary, or as now it is given and procured from the Assem-
 bly, and to give me your advice next year touching
 you thinke best to be further done in that matter touch-
 ing Coyns, for if our admittance be given by the good ju-
 rors of it this year there will be a great amount of advantage
 in it the next year.

Mr Thomas Howard by his Lett of this year to me; has
 informed that a charge having bene put in against
 him in the Court by my Attorney, and he ready to defend
 himselfe, the suite is lett fall, which he saith is but a
 satisfaction to him, and desires my Lett to absolve him selfe
 from the Court, untill he have some reparation in his
 honour, which is but reason why he should leave, and he
 should not sit in the Court while his reputation lies
 under any blemish, therefore you shall doe well if he
 shall desire it from you, to examine the Complain-
 t that are against him, and according to the merit of
 the Cause acquit or censure him.

In the said Lett touching Religion may be in whole
 ly observed both in the Provinciall and all inferior Courts
 of the Province; I have caused some copies of it to be
 printed, and sent over to you, one whereof you
 have sett up in some convenient place of the House
 where any Court shall be held in my Province, and
 afore the Court break up, And I humbly require and
 enioyne you to maintain that Lett and proceede in all
 your Courts exactly according to it, and to see that all
 Commissioners in those County Courts doe so too.

I perceive by some Lett of this year that there is a
 question moved by some whether foliis goods are not
 included in our order those words in the Grant of a
 Mannor (profits most usually belonging to Mannors
 in England) which because it may perhaps some-
 times be questioned in the Court there, I thinke it fitt to pre-
 acquaint you that foliis are not profits either most
 usually or at all belonging to any Mannor in England
 in vertue of its being a Mannor, but is and must be granted
 by speciall favor, and speciall words, and is many times
 granted to some in other maner Mannors, and hereof I re-
 quire you to take notice if ever the Cause should happen to
 come before you.
