Memorandum that upon the 20th of December in the year of our
 Lord 1660 sent the Brother of Ottapongasson in a company with
 the Quakers of Portobarr. Nanpauit and other the Indians
 Inhabiting that Quarter of the Province to me Philip Calvert Secre-
 tary and the said Governor of the Province of Maryland to desire of
 me the continuance of the peace formerly made with the said
 Emperor of the said Province, sending also a present from Ottapongass-
 on the said present Emperor in token of his perfect friendship, which
 upon I desired him to know how Ottapongasson said to be King
 whether by Succession or Election? or by what other title he
 answered by the Interpreter Mr. Thomas Mathews setting forth the
 title of their King in this manner viz

That long ago there came a King from the Eastern Shores who
 commanded over all the Indians now inhabiting within the bounds of
 the Province naming every town so be called and also over the
 Patowmack and Sasquehannough, whom for that he did as it
 were in peace and rob them all they called Ottapongasson
 the man dying without issue made his brother Quobonasson
 King after him, after whom succeeded his other brother, after
