Upon consideration of writing, It is therefore ordered that
he pay the next year to the Lord Proprietary two hundred
pounds of tobacco and fash as also all just goods
Respective Officers of the courts and that he have one
year assigned for the disposal of his Estate
to depart the Province; and in the Interim to be
Recognizant for his good behaviour.

In our Lord God Everlasting Wher as upon the two
Seaventy day of February last there passed in our Pro-
vince against Josias Hondall a Sentence of Banishment
out of this Province and forfeiture and confiscation of
his Estate both real and personall to us and our heirs
Wher as the said Josias Hondall having in that behalfe
petitioned our Governour and Countt for mercy and mi-
tion of that Sentence; Now ye that know by the advice
our said Governour and Countt have thought fitt and
haved by pardon the said Josias Hondall and acquitt him
all the fines of writing he was indicted the said twenty se-
vnte day of February last And also of all and singular
pains and punishment which he had by inured
of writing he had judgment the said twenty seaventy day
February last Sabing that he shall not at any tyme here-
to come be any officer within this Province nor have any
nor be elected Burgess in any future Generall Assembly
this Province and shall also give sufficient Security for
Good behaviour towards us and our Governour and
always that the said Josias shall not by this our pardon
intended or intended to be pardoned or acquitted of
of his just debts formerly due to us or any person within
the sum of fifty pounds ster. due to us for a fine
