

= Every other way, out the way of Captains Thomas Gordon
 or of James Blaufon from whence they shall have liberty
 have occasion to come further among the English plantations, and
 that if by Enquiries they be driven down amongst the English
 they shall be bound to attend before they come unto any English
 place, and upon the appearance of any English they shall im-
 = mediately lay down their Arms and suffer their Men to be in
 the English possession till their departure.

8 That the Sasquahannoughs shall send all Run awayes of the
 English down to Capt. Thomas Herbert, immediately after their
 arrival at the Point;

9 That the English having now declared that they will demand
 satisfaction of the Passagon Indians, for the death of John
 Gordon, and his companions slayed by the aforesaid Indians
 and upon refusal to performe, a warre with them to be
 shannoughs shall upon further notice given be ready to fight
 in the said warre with necessary force
