

2<sup>ly</sup> It is agreed betwixt the aboardsaid parties that in case any English man for the future shall happen to finde any Papayoulo Indian killing either father or Mother that then it shall be lawfull for the English to kill the said Indian.

3<sup>ly</sup> It is agreed betwixt the aboardsaid parties that in case any Indian or Indians shall happen to kill any English man for the future (whiche God forbid) that then the said Indian with all that company of Indians with him whiche consented to the said murder shall be delivered up to the English there to be punished against according to the laws of this Province.

4<sup>ly</sup> It is further agreed betwixt the aboardsaid parties that in case any English man shall happen to run amongst the Papayoulo Indians that the said Indians bring them to Peter Meyor and there for every English man that they shall deliver they shall receive one Mategoale.
