

Record, showing unto the Court that unless such
 partition be speedily made that every one knowing
 his parts may improve it, the children will intem-
 =tably be undone by permitting the housing and plan-
 =tation now already provided and built runne to runne
 =down. That a writt of partition issued to the
 =Sheriffe of Calvert County to see partition made
 =by a Jury of twelve men of the neighbour hood appor-
 =ting to the honor and purpose of the will (vizt) that
 =they first lay out unto Robert Bennicke one hundred
 =acres next unto St. Huberts Brooke and that in
 =afterwards they divide all the remaynd. of St. Huberts
 =Manor (excepting that parcel lying Westward of
 =the doore entrance of St. Huberts West by the said
 =will devised unto said Bennicke) into five parts of
 =equal vallue having regard to the Goodnes of the land
 =not the number of acres And that then they first
 =give unto Robert Bennicke his share next adjoining
 =to his land upon St. Huberts Brooke and afterwards
 =that they permitt the other brethren to chuse by lotte
 =their shares so divided as aforesaid the eldest of
 =them chusing first and so the next in seniority till
 =every one have his parts.

 =him and told him that they could not supply their
 =men to furnish the Indian with provisions according
 =to Articles, and therefore bid them provide themselves
 =to be gone to morrow for their next passage to go
 =to carry downe the Ammunition by water.
