great abuse in Exportation of furs and Graynes
we hereby straitly charge and command that no
person whatsoever presume to Exporte any
of furs or Graynes out of this Province without
Exporte warrant under the privy Seale of this
under the penalty of treble amount the
Queen at St. Marys this seventh day of
