person and his Indians were to have for every plantation six mat  
to be paid by them that seates such plantations. That they  
to bring in all runaway Indians for which they were to receive a matter  
of pole for every runaway delivered. That they should not kill  
then any the English neither should any English murder any  
That if the Indians stole any thing from the English they should  
as also the English should pay for any thing they stole from the In  
Icane the English like not of the Dutch Tradeinge with them  
would prohibit the Dutch Tradeinge with them provided they  
supplied with necessaries from the English. That noe English man  
should pass through those quarters without a pass from the Govern  
Magistrate thereunto authorized.

Where vpon it was ordered first that some fitt person be author  
conclude a peace with the Emperour of Nanticoke vpon the  
next Articles to be entred vponed. and that the
