[unclear] doe take the said Wrights deposition concerning the same and returne it into the Secretarys office.

Ordered that James Giffon, John Sturton, Ed. Hoskins, Thom. Taylor, Ralph Dodson, Hon. Trith [unclear] Rowland Moulton be kept in the Sheriffes hands till they finde sufficient security to appear at the next Provinciall Court and for their good behavior in the tyme and it is likewise ordered that John Halsehead, John [unclear] about Macklane doe give in security to appear here to present their Complaint.

Ordered that the pet^r. have a Licence to trade for Coyne as is desired. Licence also to the pet^r. to trade for Coyne as usually.

The Examination of John Edgey took
