That whereas your Petitioner hath received much damage to his
 person with hazard of his life Received by Capt. Robert Troope
 whereby he is made incapable of getting a livelihood, and by which
 means his Cloathes and what goods hee brought into the Province
 were carryed away by the vessel in which hee was imported.
 Therefore your petitioner humbly prayeth your honors to take his
 present distressed condition into your serious considerations for
 sustenance, and for the curinge of his wounds by the above mentioned
 Capt Troope, and your petitioner shall pray

 they doe provide him dyet, Cloathes, and Lodginge, and likewise to see

 be satisfied accordinge as the Provinciall C^o. shall order
