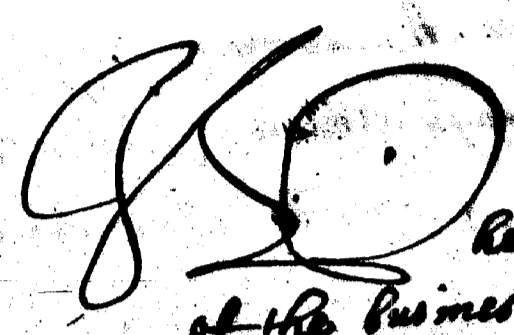


Agreement made by Henry Small Esq.

St. Marys this 11th of February 1662



Whereas there is no certain day appointed for the dispatch
of the business concerning Administrations, rights to land, and other
actions of menum and tunc, and for that reason the Justices
of this Province doe many times lose their labours repaying to
St. Marys when the officers in these severall affairs concerned are
absent.

These are to give notice that the officers concerned in the business
will constantly attend the last thurseday in every month and one
day immediately followinge at the ordinary at St. Marys, at which
and by one all persons concerned are required to attend, and at such
time for the dispatch of their businesses as aforesaid, and all the Justices
of this Province are hereby required to take notice of this
intimation, and not to importune the officers at other times.

The humble petition of the souldiers of the Jle of Kent

Sheweth
That Captⁿ Thomas Bred now late of the Jle of Kent deceased, doe
for fines to the value of six or seven thousand pounds of tobacco
hee was to buy Drum and Collets and other necessarys for the use of
the Company, which hee hath not done but converted it to his own
use. your Petitioners humbly prayes that there may be an account
of given to our Captⁿ will Leedy, and that hee may have the
times to buy Drum and Collets, and to dispose of the remanent
for the use of the J^t Company at his discretion: and your Petitioners
