could not have done my business, nor have returned home
before I had bene at James Towne. Where I doe believe
it would have bene exacted more particularly. Col^l Scar-
borough telling mee, if my answer was like to^t of the
Triall of Delphos. When he had my Response, hee told
mee that if hee wou^{ld} hee wou^{ld} be up wth us before
James Towne Court, if not presently after, & make of
same demand of every particular p^{er}son, & on Jersey
wou^{ld} according to his Order lett of Broad Arrows on
the backe of him that should refuse to give a sh^{ill}face
