I shall not fayle to appoynt Commis<sup>rs</sup> for to attend those  
yo<sup>r</sup> here nominated, & at the time & place yo<sup>r</sup> have menti-  
oned. Where I will endeavor my selfe to wayte on yo<sup>r</sup>, if  
other Business of w<sup>ch</sup> I am to give his of an account of  
by this shipping, doe not disapoynt mee of yo<sup>r</sup> honour.

I hope some way may then be found & agreed on  
by w<sup>ch</sup> we may better our State & condition, as for yo<sup>r</sup> present  
wee are in. This I question not but will be accepted of  
by all here in general, & most in particular by

on y<sup>e</sup> Eighth Day of May next.
